2021 Site Improvement Plan Priorities

As a staff we have begun to implement our 2021 priorities which include; Literacy improvement, numeracy improvement and a continued focus on wellbeing and engagement.

Wellbeing & Engagement

We want our students to be able to articulate 'what they are learning, why they are learning it and how they know when they've learnt it.' We want our students to have the skills required to be successful learners not only at school, but beyond the classroom. We want our students to demonstrate empathy and kindness. Our Meadows Primary School Learner Qualities is a great place to start with this journey.

Literacy

We want all of our students to demonstrate growth... every child in every class. We will use evidence based programs and resources to tailor literacy learning that will help our student meet DfE benchmarks and elevate to high band achievement. Some new focus will be around the Big 6 of Reading, The Simple View of Reading and explicit teaching of phonics and spelling rules within classes.

Numeracy

We will continue to focus on increasing student achievement in maths through problem solving and reasoning. We will also increase automaticity and trust the count through interventions from R-7. We will use Back to Front maths and the Big Ideas in Number to help inform teacher practice

I look forward to seeing many of you at the Acquaintance Evening and AGM next Tuesday.

2021 FESTIVAL OF MUSIC

We are very excited to start our Choir year with our first rehearsal this Thursday. Choir is available for students from years 5, 6 and 7. The first few lessons students are welcome to come and give choir a try but from week 6 students will be asked to make a commitment as we learn the songs to be performed at assemblies, local performances and the Festival of Music at the Festival Theatre. Choir books are now available for purchase from the office for \$25. This year students are also able to stream the music via the Festival of Music app.

Student Voice and Agency is alive and well with our Year 5-6 students in Room 4!

All students and staff across the school have been busy in the first few weeks establishing relationships, setting classroom routines, expectations and learner goals with a focus on our Learner Qualities: Brave, Collaborative, Curious and Self-directed. To demonstrate our commitment towards our learning, we created a class mantra that included a collaborative view of what we thought each of the values meant to us. This then became our Class Contract.

In Room 4, we have celebrated these actions in a variety of ways beginning with the co-designing of student Learning Journey posters. Teachers and students have worked together to plan and discuss what information was to be shared and presented. The posters include: learning goals, personal interests, learner strengths, dispositions and styles, how the teacher can help and one skill that the student can teach another.



As part of our class commitment to the whole school focus on the 'Brave' Learner Quality, we began by sharing what it was like to feel stuck and how we have used a Growth Mindset to navigate our way out of The Learner Pit. Our students identified a personal moment, shared their feelings and strategies towards achieving success and how they could support another person.

Our students have also participated in a variety of Formative Assessment strategies used to share personal, teacher and peer feedback and understanding. We have used Exit Cards to share student understanding as well as Plickers digital technology to collect instant multiple-choice responses to questions created by the teachers, without requiring the use of computers or tablets only a unique printed card assigned to each student. Our students and looking forward to creating their own surveys and quizzes using this technology in the coming weeks.

Throughout the past two weeks, students have been intently discussing the roles and responsibilities at both a classroom and whole school community level. To do this, students collectively unpacked what was involved in each job and then outlined the qualities and skills that they might need in order to be successful in that role. By acknowledging what makes a great leader and by making connections to their own personal experiences, students were able to diligently plan, draft and write Job Applications for these roles and present these to fellow classmates and staff. Those students aspiring to be School Leaders and in House Captains roles will also have the opportunity to present these speeches to the whole school as a part of the selection process. A big well done to those that have stepped up to apply and good luck to everyone! We can already see some excellent leadership happening here at Meadows in Room 4.
















School drop off and pick


